Dear David,

On behalf of the Committee administering the 1999 Biomathematics Comprehensive Examinations, I am happy to be able to inform you that you passed a sufficient number of them at the MS level to enable that component of the Masters degree requirements to be met. There are two additional components to be considered: completion of the minimum number of courses that is required, and an appropriate GPA. The course requirements seem to be met: at least 36 units completed, of which at least 20 are in graduate level courses.

However, primarily because of a lapsed and an about-to-lapse (should you return from leave) Incomplete, the 3.0 requirement might not be met, depending on what can be done to cope with this. One possibility is to register this Fall and remove at least one of the Incompletes. Another might be, though we cannot assure this at the present time, to retrospectively drop one of those courses. David Tomita has been in contact with the Graduate Division regarding these options. I suggest that you consult with him on this matter, as soon as you can.
